USE OF SCHOOL SWIMMING POOL PROCEDURE

PRINCIPLE:

Tokomaru School maintains its swimming pool for safe use by pupils of the school. Where appropriate, these procedures are based on recommendations as outlined in the New Zealand Standard NZS5826: 2010 Pool Water Quality.

PROCEDURES:

A. Pool Use

- 1. The school pool will be available for swimming by pupils of the school from the beginning of Term 1 until a date decided at the discretion of the Principal (usually around Week 6) during school hours / while school is open. It will also be open towards the end of Term 4 (weather permitting).
- 2. No animals are permitted in the swimming pool (and no dogs are allowed on school property).
- 3. The fencing around the pool will be maintained according to Ministry of Education guidelines, and access to the pool is only to occur through a single gate. This gate is to remain locked during times when the pool is not in use.

B. Pool Water Testing

- 1. At the commencement of each swimming season, the school employee with the responsibility for water testing/water treatment (Caretaker/ nominated person) is to review his/her testing and treatment procedures with the Principal.
- 2. During weekdays (and once over the weekend), pool water is tested daily and treated as appropriate.
- 3. During the first two weeks of the swimming season, a sample of treated water will be sent to an independent laboratory for further microbial testing to ensure that the water treatment procedure at the school is satisfactory.
- 4. Material Safety Data sheets covering all hazardous chemicals used in pool water treatment are to be available to the employee responsible for water testing/treatment.
- 5. It is the responsibility of the BOT to ensure that the employee understands the implications of use of the chemicals outlined within the Material Safety Data sheets.
